Holiday Memories.

In 1913, an Aunt of mine, who was still a young girl, set out from Ireland to take the name in religious life of Sister Mary Bernard. Her journey took her from Liverpool to Montreal, a boat journey of over a week. She then travelled across Canada by train to Vancouver. The journey took her five full days. She wished to serve on the Missions and joined in Canada, the Sisters of the Child Jesus who were associated with the Oblate Fathers. There she was to spend her life as a dedicated Sister and teacher until her death in 1960, the year before I was ordained a priest. Vancouver at the time, 1913, was a large town of about 60,000 inhabitants. Today it has grown to a city of over 2 million souls.

This Summer, I travelled to Vancouver as part of a visit to Canada. I made contact with the Sisters. I wish to thank Sister Denise especially for the trouble she took to bring me to the places she worked and a particularly moving moment for me was to visit her grave in North Vancouver. I also visited St. Paul's Hospital in the city where she died on April 11th 1960. It was beside our hotel in downtown Vancouver.

At her death there was no family present or at her funeral, but she was surrounded by the love and care of her religious community. I still remember listening to my father reading aloud the account of her death and funeral when a letter arrived from Vancouver in late April 1960.

Reflecting afterwards, I thought of and prayed for so many generous and dedicated Irish Missionaries who served the Lord and His people in many far flung lands and today lie in graves where no relations have had the opportunity to visit. For me that visit to St. Joseph's Cemetery in North Vancouver was a special day. It was also a significant day, 9th August, because it was Sister Mary Bernard's birthday. Perhaps it was meant to happen that way. May she rest in peace.

Father Denis O'Kane

Father Denis was known as the 'Donegal Dynamo'. He was very active here in St. Agnes, where he served as a curate. And the same spirit marked his ministry in other appointments also. He is credited with establishing the first full time Parish Office in the Diocese and appointed Teresa Driver as Secretary. He retired as Parish Priest of Donabate and had been in declining health for some time. He died in July and was laid to rest in his native Donegal.
