The great French painter Henri Matisse died in 1954 at the age of 86.

In the last years of his life arthritis crippled and deformed his hands making it extremely difficult for him to hold the paint brush yet he continued to paint, placing a bandage between his fingers to prevent the brush from slipping.

One day someone asked him why he pushed his body to such suffering; why he continued to paint despite the great physical pain this entailed. Matisse replied- "The pain passes, but the beauty remains".

In a similar way the pain to which Jesus submitted in his Passion would pass, but the beauty of what he did remains forever.

'Nothing is costly to one who doesn't count the cost' could be a motto of encouragement to us in our own suffering and pain. It is the message of the Passion and the Resurrection of Christ.

The Facts:

1. Approximately 650 priests hold appointments in the Diocese from the Archbishop of Dublin.
2. At present, the Diocese has 14 seminarians. Most are studying at St. Patrick's College, Maynooth. One student is at the Irish College in Rome.
3. There is one student for Ordination in the Diocese this year.
4. The majority of our students for the Diocese are in their late twenties or thirties, and have given up careers to study for the priesthood.

2. To save us he was crucified, Raising our hearts when hope had died. (R)


3. Bringing him gifts of bread and wine. We receive back, his life divine. (R)
