**A Power Within**

A very influential and highly regarded dictionary published in 1944 carried the following interesting definition of "Uranium"

*'Uranium is a rare, heavy white metallic element. It is not found generally and has no important uses although certain of its salts are used as pigments especially in the manufacture of glass and porcelain.'*

*"No important uses" this was used disparagingly of something which is today, in all probability, the most valuable metal in existence. Little did people realise then, the importance and significance of this single element. Nor did they anticipate the worldwide fear and trepidation future generations would experience regarding its possible misuse.*

*It is never wise to judge by appearances: Externals may cause us to think disparagingly of others. Indeed it is possible for us to think that we ourselves have 'no important uses'. Forgetting that each of us has the 'Potential' for being bearers of light or bearers of darkness. All the time there are untapped sources for goodness in the lives of each one of us. They can lie dormant, but once stirred by the Holy Spirit and strengthened by God's grace we are enabled to go and make the community in which we live and work better for our presence. Bringing joy, comfort, consolation, a new vision to those in need. Of course we can do the opposite. Bringing darkness instead of light by leading a selfish life: But Jesus calls us to be children of light not darkness: It is demanding but it is fulfilling, it is walking in the footsteps of Christ Himself.*

The United Nations Development Programme estimates that 70% of those living in poverty are women. All of this work is possible because of the valued support of **Crumlin Parish**.
