**CHRISTMAS PREPARATIONS ABROAD**

Christmas in the Philippines is incomparable. It is probably the longest in the world. It begins as early as September and ends as late as the end of January. With the arrival of the "...ber" months (September, October etc.) you can already hear strains of Christmas Carols everywhere—in the malls, on the streets and even in offices. Competitions for the best "Belen" or crib are everywhere especially in the financial district. It seems that Filipinos cannot wait for Christmas.

A predominantly Catholic country, Christmas is above all, a religious celebration. It is the season to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. For nine days, beginning on December 16th the people flock in their millions to the Churches for the traditional "Misa de Gallo" or the "Dawn Masses" at 4:00am. Many are awake at 2:00am and go early to secure a seat. The Churches are packed and often the crowds spill out onto the Church grounds. This tradition was introduced by the Spanish Friars to allow farmers to hear Mass before going to the fields early in the morning. Church bells peal out and Christmas music will be played over a public address system—so even if you're not inclined to venture out of bed—you can't sleep either—you might as well join the rest of humanity. After Mass the people pick up steamed rice cakes being prepared outside and they take them home for breakfast with hot chocolate. On Christmas Eve, the people have a Paminuluyan or drama which re-enacts the search of Mary & Joseph for an Inn. A couple dressed as Mary and Joseph knock at the door of the houses looking for a room. They are unable to find a house willing to take them in. The drama ends with the couple seeking refuge in the Church, just in time for the "Misa de Aguinaldo" or "Gift Mass" The couple accompanied by children dressed as Angels process to a make-shift manger and place the child there, the congregation sing the "Gloria" accompanied by the tolling of Church Bells. Christmas carols are sung by Carollers going from house to house. After this Midnight Mass, all return home for the much awaited "Noche Buena" feast of food.

Of all the decorations of Christmas the "Parol" or Christmas Star takes prominence. Rich and poor alike will have one or more. This star/lantern which symbolises the star that guided the Magi to the new born Saviour hangs proudly by the window of every Filipino home. In spite of the onslaught of commercialism the people try to preserve the real meaning of Christmas, it is a season of joy, a season of peace, a season of being with one's family, and most especially, a season to thank God for the gift of His Son.

I was privileged to be part of this celebration for thirty four years and I miss it. If we in Ireland were to tell others about our Irish Christmas, how would we describe it?
