### Courage not Paralysis

Last Mondays Gospel reading was taken from St. Luke, Chapter 5, Verse 17-26. Perhaps you might take down your Bible and read it. I have always found the story told fascinating. It is about the paralyzed man who needed the help of relations and friends to bring him to Jesus. You will recall how they had to cut a hole in the roof of the house in order to lower him before Jesus.

The kind of paralysis I wish to mention this day is the kind where good people feel unable to speak out against evil. This can be because of the fear of intimidation or being laughed at. Through silence evil is unchallenged. The Church and society can also remain silent.

Recently I must say I admired the Parish Priest of Darndale near Coolock who spoke out publicly about the drug problems in the area. At the latest funeral of a victim and in the presence of those who know who were selling drugs he condemned in strong words the dealers who brought such pain into the lives of families in the area.

In his efforts to fight against those who pedalled drugs in the Parish, he himself was the victim of intimidation with the word rat daubed on his house and Church.

We must commend the courage of Father Terry Murray in speaking out. In speaking the truth of the Gospel he too had to pay a price and it takes a brave man to hold his ground against evil.

Let us pray for Father Terry, who certainly has not been paralysed into silence. His faith and courage will win out in the end. Father John.




### All people that on Earth do dwell
