Lock Them Up.

Many of you may have experienced theft or robbery at home or abroad. It is not very pleasant to arrive to find your home turned upside down following a break in. or to have your car stolen or to find your purse or wallet gone. Your natural reaction is to be angry and hope that the criminal would be caught and "locked up". This weekend we are asked to pray for victims but also to remember prisoners. They are sadly often victims also, because of their upbringing or the company they were exposed to. Many of us could say "Their but for the grace of God, go I". Despite the hard exterior many minor criminals are safe on the inside and locking them up only exposes them to bullying or in order to gain acceptance they find prison a learning place and after release they become more deeply involved in crime. Some prisoners go through a genuine conversion and find Christ in their lives. Those of us who try to live good and honest lives in calling for justice sometimes mean vengeance. We must learn to forgive like Jesus did to those who unjustly condemned Him. Bible Alive has an international prison outreach. Through the support of readers they send over 2000 copies of their magazine to prisoners all over the world. The outreach is bringing hope to prisoners who feel cut off from society and rejected by people. Let us leave the final word with one prisoner writing to the editor "I have never seen Bible Alive before. Some ladies who visited the prison arranged for me to receive it. Isolation and alienation are real problems that affect people in prison making us feel lost and alone and hopeless. It is so important that prisoners receive the hope and love of Jesus Christ".
