The well-known maxim of Marshall McLuhan, the Canadian media theorist, The Medium is the Message, was appropriately adapted by Darryl D'Souza to develop his ordination motto: To be the Medium of God's Message which succinctly illustrates his pastoral mission.

Ordained in 1996, Darryl, a media and peace educator, is a Salesian embarking on his doctoral research in communications in Ireland after an experience of more than ten years of media practice in India.

Having completed his post graduation in media studies, he was appointed as director of the Salesian publishing and production house in Mumbai. He was also elected as Secretary-Treasurer of BOSCOM South Asia and SIGNIS INDIA Western Region.

Apart from working in three native speaking mission parishes in India, he has given over 50 courses in Media and Peace Education to a wide category of people including students, teachers and church personnel on local and national level. Several of his articles are published in Journals and Periodicals. He has shot several short films and documentaries on social issues.

His interests include listening to and composing music especially hymns and community songs. He also enjoys making issue based short films especially with the participation of youth.

Says Darryl: "Jesus, the deepest communication of the Father, was a media person. He used imagery which even the most ordinary person could identify with. His words went straight to the heart of the people who heard them. His actions transformed their lives. Every Christian is a witness of Jesus, His medium."

Archdeacon Daniel Hickey was the first Parish Priest of Crumlin from the foundation of the Parish in 1941 until his death in 1956. This year we celebrate the 50th anniversary of his death.
