## Preachers of the Good News

In the Gospel we are asked to 'go out to all nations and spread the word of God'. So what is mission? Is it a place? Is it a thing? No... mission is YOU! You and the life you live is a testament and powerful example of God's love for everyone. Years ago and to this day missionaries left Ireland and went all around the world to spread God's love. This is called evangelisation. They went out and helped those who were suffering, and lived among them through all their troubles. Missionaries stayed with the people and they wondered why they did it. They witnessed by their lives and their commitment to the people. If we only think of mission as something that happens in foreign countries, then it becomes something that "they" do and I need not concern myself with it. But Pope Francis in The Joy of the Gospel calls everyone to take up the role of preachers of the Good News, 'joyfully bringing Jesus to every street and every corner of the earth.'

The 29<sup>th</sup> of Sept, 2014 was a special day for the Columban Sisters as they celebrated their 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in the different mission areas across Asia, the Americas and Europe. In her address the Congregational Leader said "We are united with our Sisters throughout the world as we look back with deep gratitude on the profusion of blessings that have been showered on us and on the truly thousands of people who have through our words and deeds in Christ, come to believe in and experience God's love for them." We can do the same.

This October as we reflect on mission, perhaps we can take up the challenge of the Holy Father to ask what can I do as an individual, or even better what can we do as parish, to become missionaries, bringing the joy of Jesus Christ into the places that we go.
