REFLECTING GOD'S LOVE

'Your Mission, should you choose to accept it....' is to 'Go, in peace to love and serve the Lord.' Is this Mission Impossible or more importantly, how do we make the Mission Possible for every situation, time or place we find ourselves in?

While growing up, I always related mission or missionary work with priests or religious who had gone to far off lands to preach the Gospel. While recognising this as tremendous work, it never had a large impact on my thinking, or my way of life, basically, I never saw it as relevant for a young person in Ireland. How wrong was I!

'Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.' Not only does this ring out every time we leave Mass, it rings out throughout Scripture and the Teaching of the Church. We're sent out, given a mission, a job to do. It doesn't matter what age we are or where in the world we find ourselves.

Some months ago I found myself with an opportunity to work in a shelter for people who are homeless. Meeting some of the clients that day in the shelter, talking with them and getting to know them, they were the ones to make me feel welcome, asking me how I was settling in, they were the ones who showed me love and support. This has given me a greater understanding of God's love. This is the mission we're called to, to love and be loved, this can happen anywhere, not just in far off lands and it's certainly not mission impossible!

MEMORIES OF A GREAT TEACHER PART 2

Sinead Norton Boland continues her portrait of Sr. Angela, former Principal of the Assumption Primary School in Walkinstown, and known to many in the area:

Like many school Principals, Sr. Angela had that delightful little habit of bursting into classrooms totally unannounced. Unlike most, however, she would frequently launch straight into song, usually a lively hymn or song. On one memorable occasion, I had a student from St Patrick's College of Education in my classroom doing Teaching Practice. Unknown to Sr. Angela, inconspicuously tucked away in the corner sat the student's supervisor from the College, observing a lesson in Maths. Without warning, the door opened, in swept Sr. Angela, habit flowing and beads jangling and within seconds the whole class (only too delighted, like any class to interrupt lessons), was singing with great gusto:

"Praise Him, Praise, Him, Praise Him in the morning, Praise Him in the noontime, Praise Him, Praise Him, Praise Him 'till the sun goes down!"

They were on their third or fourth rendering o the above when there was a shriek of horror as Sr. Angela spotted the supervisor. (The man was no doubt revelling in this fly-on-the-wall view of real life school). Then began the ructions as I, the innocent yet guilty bystander, was berated and upbraided for my mute stance about the visitor. But seriously, wouldn't only a spoilsport interrupt such wonderful proceedings ?
