The Emmaus Vocation Journey

The Dublin Diocesan Centre is organising this Journey of discovery and invites any young person [18-35yrs or so] who wants to live the Gospel more fully, and who wants to discover the call of God in his or her life.

You are invited to set aside six Saturday afternoons & one weekend, between Nov. 6th 06 and April 07 to take part in this journey of discovery.

The afternoon sessions will take place at St. Alphonsus Monastery, St. Alphonsus Road, Drumcondra, Dublin 9. Each of these meetings [11am-approx 3pm.] will include: quiet prayer using scripture: Short presentation on theme and discussion: Mass: Light meal. Dates for these Saturday afternoons are 4th Nov.06: 9th Dec. 06: 13th Jan 07: 3rd Feb. 07: 10th Mar 07: 28th April 07.

The weekend will take place at Teach Lorcain, Glendassan, Glendalough. [Fri 30th Mar-Sun. 1st April 07]. Here you will have space to pray, time to relax, to walk and to enjoy created nature at its best. It will give an opportunity for all involved in the Emmaus Vocation Journey to focus on their own unique calling in life and to discover more fully where God is calling you.

Luke 24:32 They asked each other "were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road & opened the Scriptures to us".

Setting out on their journey to Emmaus the two disciples were downcast, having been deeply pained by the death of Jesus. The stranger walking with them explained the scriptures to them. When they reached Emmaus they were greatly enlightened and only in the breaking of bread did they recognise Jesus. They immediately returned to Jerusalem to serve the Lord.

In every generation Jesus calls disciples to serve His Body-the Church. We are all aware of the stormy times that the Church is experiencing in our own time and how it needs priests, religious and a committed and enlightened laity. So the INVITATION to you to come apart for a while and through prayer, scripture and the Mass, walk this Emmaus Vocation Journey. The hope of our journey is that, like the disciples in the Gospel, you may come to know where the Lord is leading and what his call holds for you. Do "Come And See".
