CELEBRATING BAPTISM

This weekend we welcome back to St Agnes Church some of the children baptised over the past year in our Parish. I am sure they are healthy and well and we will hear them competing with the choir and the Celebrant of the 12 noon Mass. May the Lord bless them all.

Perhaps it is the occasion to acknowledge with gratitude, the work of the Baptismal Team who help at the Pre-Baptism meeting and at the Church ceremonies. We thank you on behalf of the Parish Clergy and families for all your help.

May we remind parents of the need to give at least one month's notice of the date of the Baptism. This is important as the Sacrament is simply too important to be 'rushed' at short notice. It is also unfair to give such short notice to the Baptismal team.

The first name you choose for your child is special to that child and is called the 'Christian Name', so that among the names you should always pick the name of a Saint. When I see some of the names chosen for children nowadays, I wonder have we lost this Christian dimension to Baptism. It is not just a naming ceremony. I personally would not like to be afflicted with the names some parents give to their children.

To be made a Godparent to a child is more than just an honour given to a relative or friend. It is a responsibility and the person chosen should be a person of faith who can be an example and witness for the child in the years ahead.

Again today we warmly welcome the children and their families. May the children grow up in homes where they are loved and cherished and where they come to know God and where they make their first steps in faith and prayer.

FACTS ABOUT TRADE

World trade rules take £1.3bn a day away from poor countries. This is fourteen times what they get in aid. Tariff barriers in rich countries are four times higher for poor countries than for industrialised countries. Coffee is second only to crude oil as the worlds most highly traded commodity. 70% of the worlds coffee is grown on farms of less than 10 hectares. The vast majority is grown on family plots of between one and five hectares. A bag of coffee bought for US\$50 in the third world can retail in Irish Coffee shops for between US\$15,000 and US\$20,000
