

WORLD YOUTH DAY—Rio 2013


I was delighted when St Agnes Parish invited me to attend World Youth Day 2013. Rio de Janeiro is a vibrant, religious city but with a vast economic disparity between its upper and lower classes. I thought it would be insightful to witness people who, despite their obvious hardships, are unwilling to give up their faith as quickly as my contemporaries have.

Sure enough, a guided tour of Rio gave us a window onto the residents' lives, from the colour and culture of the lower classes' favelas to the manicured landscapes and soft beaches frequented by the working and upper classes. The citizens are divided, not just geographically, but by the lifestyles they're born into. I contemplated how this duality exists without creating dramatic social unrest.

During the WYD event, young Catholics from different countries, cultures and languages were united under one creed, and as the archbishop of Rio kicked off the celebrations, the excitement exuded by the crowd was palpable for everyone involved. This level of intensity continued throughout the week as workshops and events broke out across the city, offering pilgrims a taste of the local culture and trials regularly experienced by Brazilians. But the fever didn't reach its crescendo until Pope Francis arrived a few days later. That's when it became apparent that, while we were all different and had walked our own roads to get here, we really were all one voice to a common belief.

On our last day, as I stood beneath the statue of Christ the Redeemer, I stared out at the city and thought about all that I'd experienced there. It finally became apparent just how relevant the WYD creed is to us. I learned that it's up to us to 'go and make disciples of all nations.' As long as we don't give up on the world, all hope and faith is not lost.
