There was the empty tomb, the women's stories and the He had himself come to them through locked doors, was he really alive? It was all too much. Peter, ever on the move, was going back to the things he understood, boats and nets and fish. He was going fishing, going to the familiar sound of water lapping the boat, the swish of the nets, the waiting, the cold, the silence of the night. But now, after all, there was nothing. Empty nets. "Cast the nets again", the man on the shore called. Why not, it might humour him. And then the net—breaking haul. "It is the Lord!" it could only be Him. Peter knew, all richness and abundance and gift. Only Jesus. The long night was over. "Come and have breakfast".. It was an invitation not just to the bread and fish he had ready for them, but to a new beginning, a new life. SHARE began in the 1970's with the growth if the Diocese and the need to provide the developing area with Churches, Schools and accommodation for priests. However times and circumstances have changed. Today we need to pool and share human resources through the provision of services to parishes by our Diocesan offices and Agencies. So at this time, SHARE has been increasingly funding pastoral supports for mission and evangelisation in our Parish communities

The Archbishop thanks the people of the Diocese for their continued generosity to the SHARE collection and asks you to continue your wonderful support to SHARE.

Last year St Agnes Parish contributed €135,746 to SHARE. Only Donnybrook and Kilmacud exceeded this figure. Thank you once again for your great generosity
