### Good Shepherd Sunday and Vocation Sunday

This Sunday's gospel is comforting and reassuring. We have the Good Shepherd who leads us. We have a task: lay down our lives for others.

Jesus has proven his trustworthiness as a Good Shepherd. He has already laid down his life for his sheep. He has done this freely in response to the Father's command and love. We Jesus' disciples, receive the same command from him. We are not to be "hired" hands but good shepherds who, by listening to his voice leading us, lay down our lives for others. In the Father's love we too gather all people into one flock by laying down our lives for others. Jesus is the Good Shepherd. So we are to be.

Our Christian living then, is about relating to others as the Father and Good Shepherd have related to us. The gospel uses "love" as a way to describe the community and unity between the Father and Jesus, between God and us, and among ourselves. If our relationship with Jesus is so lovingly intimate, then we share the same love and intimacy with each other. This is how we are all "One flock." This too is how we share in bringing salvation to others; by loving others with the same intimacy and self-giving as the Father and Jesus love us. The difference between shepherd and hired hand? Love!

Linked with Good Shepherd Sunday is Vocation Sunday when we are asked to pray for vocations. Vocation in life is not only confined to priests and religious. It can be defined as our response to God's call in particular circumstances of our lives, whether we are young or old, single or married, clerical, religious or lay. The vast majority of people are called to a lay vocation. The individual contribution that each one can or is making to the glory of God and to community can be enormous. The Christian life is a two-way movement - call and response. God calling us and then the quality the generosity of our response.

We have to discern what God is calling us to. It may be to the priesthood or religious life but ultimately our vocation is wherever we find ourselves at one with what God wants for us. Think about your vocation. How well are you living it? Are you laying down your life for others?

### Fire, Fire !!!!!

Twice in the last couple of months the candle stand at St Anthony's Shrine has gone on fire on Sunday mornings at later Masses as people have attempted to light candles beneath the shrine. There is a great danger of not only St Anthony being burned but also the whole Church.

In addition to people getting burned by touching the metals because it has over heated. We would ask that if all the spaces on the shrine are lit that you would light your candles, **blow them out** and put them in the box beside St Anthony and we will be light the candles later when there is space available.

May I also remind you that children are not permitted to light candles in the Church unless under the direct supervision of parent or guardian. This is a safety matter.



### National Collection for the 50th International Eucharistic Congress.

We are just six weeks away from the beginning of the 50th International Eucharistic Congress 2012. This is a major event for the Church in Ireland and for the world. Hosting such a Congress is costly including the rental of the RDS and Croke Park and all the other services and facilities required.

On the weekend of the 5th and 6th of May in place of Share there will be a National Collection to fund the expenses of the Eucharistic Congress. Bring a little extra in your pocket or your wallet so that you can give generously to the collection on next weekend.

### A Masterpiece

RTE and Mike Murphy are running a programme on RTE1 to choose Ireland's favourite painting. The choice has now been reduced to ten and my eye caught the title of one of them 'The Eve of St Agnes' by Harry Clarke, the famous Irish Stained Glass Artist.

While Harry Clarke is noted for his religious work and the best example in the locality is in St Joseph's Church in Terenure, best seen on a sunny day. I thought that perhaps we were missing from the Church a piece of his work; however I have discovered 'The Eve of St Agnes' is not a religious work. This work of art is based on a poem by John Keats which tells of a belief that if a young lady goes to bed on the Eve of the Feast and dreams of a man, she will marry that man she has seen in the vision.

To see the original piece of work you will find it on the display in the Hugh Lane Municipal Gallery on the Northside of Parnell Square.

This Masterpiece has strong competition. However it is an unusual and surprising work to reach the last ten among the many wonderful pieces of art on display in our different galleries in Ireland. Harry Clarke died a young man in 1931 from an illness that was a scourge at the time – T.B.
