Our Children Our Sacraments

Here in the Parish of St. Agnes, many of you will have, over the past number of months experienced or indeed participated in special liturgies that are part of the Sacramental Programme in our schools. These programmes are for children who are preparing for their First Holy Communion and for Confirmation.

The first three sacraments, Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion are called the sacraments of initiation because the rest of our life as Christians depends on them. The Catholic Church sees baptism as the first and basic sacrament since it establishes the foundation of our Christian life. Through baptism, we are re-born into the Mystical Body of Christ on earth; we become members of the Body of Christ and brothers and sisters to each other. It is the sacrament of faith and faith needs a community of believers.

Historically, the sacrament of confirmation was administered immediately after baptism since the sacrament perfects our baptism and brings us the graces of the Holy Spirit that were granted to the Apostles on Pentecost Sunday. Over time, it became customary for the Sacrament of the Eucharist to be received as the second sacrament of initiation. This sacrament is central to our lives as Christians since through it, we are fed and nourished by the Body and Blood of Christ. This is the sacrament that draws us together each Sunday as a faith community, to celebrate, and to be nourished at the table of the Lord. It is the sacrament that sends us out 'to love and serve each other'.

The Sacramental Programme which is well established in our schools prepares the younger children for their first encounter with Jesus in the sacrament of the Eucharist. It continues to support them on their faith journey towards their full initiation into the Church which takes place at the time of Confirmation. We owe a debt of gratitude to our teachers for their dedication and commitment to our children. We are well aware that the foundation of their Christian lives are now being put in place and it is on these foundations that our children will build their lives as future parents.

In the course of the special liturgies that have taken place, the children from the different schools presented themselves in our midst as candidates for the sacrament of the Eucharist and of Confirmation. Their presence amongst us signified their desire, (in the case of the children preparing for First Holy Communion), to continue on their journey of faith. Their presence highlighted for us as a Parish, the need to support these little ones and their parents, with our prayers. The children preparing to receive the sacrament of Confirmation are on the threshold of full initiation into the Church. They are on the threshold too of adult life where many challenges await them. They will be the parents of to-morrow who will pass on the Catholic faith to future generations. Strengthened by the gifts of the Holy Spirit, we wish all of them many blessings and the reassurance of our prayers.
