**Lent is in The Air**

On Friday we celebrate the feast of St. Brigid, which in Ireland is traditionally considered the first day of Spring. Although Spring does not officially begin until March, over the last week or so there has been a noticeable and welcome lengthening of the days. Mornings are brighter and there are first signs of a stretch in the evenings. This lengthening of the day at this time of the year is the source of the word 'Lent' {from the old English word 'Lencten'. The word 'Lent' therefore is associated from the start with Spring, new life, light and hope.

As we move in to the season of Lent this week, it might be no harm to remember this connection. Often when we think of Lent we think of fasting and some measure of self-sacrifice, giving up something or taking on to do something we think will make us better people. It can seem like a sort of keep fit course for the soul-something that we do because we think it might be good for us, and which if we complete leaves us a bit pleased with ourselves. More often than not, as with our new years resolutions to join a gym or get fit, we do not stay the course, and feel a little bit guilty.

But Lent is not a programme of self improvement, or another occasion for feeling bad about ourselves. It is not really in the first place about what we do or what we don't do. It is a chance to reflect on who we are, and who we could be if we were to respond to the call made in one of the Readings for Ash Wednesday; "Even now, says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart".
