Thought for the Week

Tuning in to God.

A man and his friend, who was a scientist, were walking along a busy street when suddenly the latter said, 'stop! Do you hear that?' They both stood still but all the first man heard was the sound of traffic and of people hurrying by on the pavement. Puzzled, he said, 'what do you mean? What are you hearing?' Then the scientist, bending down, moved a loose stone at the foot of the building and uncovered a chirping cricket. His friend was amazed. On that busy street, with the noise of cars and the bustle of people all around, how could his friend have heard the tiny insect? 'I suppose I am attuned to them,' he smiled 'having studied them for years and years'. They walked on.

Later that evening, recalling the incident, the man remembered an event in the story of Elijah the prophet [1 King 19 : 11-15] Elijah recognised God not in the tearing wind or the earthquake or the fire, but in the tiny whispering sound that followed. God, he thought, is found not only in the great happenings of life, in the big stories, but also in the little events that come our way. 'How tuned in am I to hearing the voice of God in my life?'

It is a question we all need to ask ourselves in our busy lives. How essential it is for us to develop a sensitivity to hearing God over the clamour and din of our days, to finding Him in the ordinary. How different it is when we are tuned in to the great rhythm of the Spirit, when we hear that 'still small voice' underneath the clamour of everyday. Then we learn to really listen, to give our full attention to the person with us, to the task at hand. Our lives may still be busy, even hectic at times, but we are centered and at peace in the depths of our being. If we ask our most gentle God to help us tune into this wavelength we can be sure He will respond. By spending even a little time each day quietening down, creating space for Him, will sharpen our focus and move us to a new level of living. We may not hear a cricket on a busy street, but the cry of a neighbour or a loved one's heart will not go unheard. Sr. Margaret.
