**INTERNATIONAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS**

Last year many will remember that we celebrated the 75th Anniversary of the Dublin Eucharistic Congress. This Anniversary evoked many happy memories of Corpus Christi Processions held throughout the streets of our native parishes in past times. However the growth of motor traffic put an end to these, except for the big one held in Cork City which still continues. To remind us of times past and on the occasion of the anniversary of the great Dublin Congress of 1932, we held our own Procession in the Church grounds in 2007.

The 49th Congress opens in Quebec this Sunday and continues until Sunday 22nd June. The theme of this year's congress is "The Eucharist, Gift of God for the Life of the World".

This experience of faith will be held in a festive atmosphere, with believers of all ages coming together from every part of the world. The Congress pilgrims will gather for a week of celebrations at the "Eucharistic City" where most of the events of the Congress will take place.

Why is this years Congress being held in Quebec? The year 2008 marks the 400th Anniversary of the founding of Quebec City, the first permanent French settlement in North America. Some French pioneers with deep faith, wanting to evangelize the Aboriginal peoples and provide spiritual support for the colonists, were joined by the Récollet missionary priests in 1615 and by the Jesuits in 1625. Together with the Ursulines and the Augustinian nuns who arrived in 1639, they laid the foundations of the Catholic Church in New France. In 1685, Monsignor François de Laval was appointed the first Bishop of New France, now Canada
