Thought for the Week

In The Name of.....

The first thing we do at the beginning of Mass is to make the sign of the cross. For those who are conscious of what they are doing, it is a simple act of faith as revealed to us in the mystery of the Trinity. We wouldn't have a clue about the Trinity if Jesus didn't tell us about it. He talked about his Father in heaven, about himself as the Son, about going back to heaven and sending us the Holy Spirit. The old catechism puts in succinctly when it said: 'In God, there are three Divine Persons, really distinct and equal in all things, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit'

Making the sign of the cross slowly I say 'In the name of the Father....' and I think of the whitethorn that lit up the countryside during the month of May; I think of how beautiful it can be over Galway Bay, when the sky reddens up and the evening sun shimmers on the water. I think of all these things because the Father is the Creator of a beautiful world of which we should be always aware of.

We move to the chest. I think of the love the Son of God showed us when he multiplied the loaves for the hungry, when he gave the ultimate and agonising proof of his love for us on Calvary.

We move to the shoulders, and as we do I think of the Holy Spirit, as giving of himself so widely that it takes the dull span of the shoulders—left and right, from one side of the world to the other to remind us of that. And so we come to the end of the blessing—the joining of hands and the concluding 'Amen' an act of faith in all that has gone before. And so I renew my faith. May the hands I join in faith be generous in giving and free to help. May the shared life of the Trinity and the wide sweep of the blessing be reflected in our lives too—in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, Amen.
