Sisters of Charity Celebrate

Almost 70 years ago the Sisters of Charity came to St Agnes Parish when they opened their Primary Schools on Armagh Road. Over that period they contributed to the education of countless children as well as being part of the life of the Parish. We rejoice with them as they celebrate a significant anniversary next month.

On 22nd July this year the Religious sisters of Charity in Ireland, England, Scotland, Zambia, Nigeria, California, Venezuela and Australia, together with their friends and co-workers will be celebrating the hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the death of Mary Aikenhead, who founded the congregation of the Sisters of Charity in 1815 for the service of the poor and especially the sick poor. There was great poverty in Ireland at that time and Mary Aikenhead, conscious of the social, economic, educational and spiritual deprivation of so many people around her, wanted to give to the poor what the rich could buy for money. With a small group of sisters she set up schools for poor children, visited the sick in their homes, and opened a hospital—St Vincent's Hospital on St Stephen's Green.



Since then her sisters have continued to minister to the needs of people in four continents, working in schools and hospitals, but especially with people who are ill, poor, homeless, depressed or suicidal, addicted to alcohol or drugs, refugees or asylum seekers, those suffering from disabilities, affected by AIDS, imprisoned or enslaved.

The Sisters of Charity are no strangers to the people of Crumlin, ever since they came here in June 1939 and opened a school which was reputed to be the largest primary school in Europe at the time. In fact it consisted of four schools, each with it's own Principal. Almost immediately the work of visiting the sick in their homes was begun and Sodalities established—children of Mary and Christian Mothers—and a Girls' Club. A Food Centre and Clothing guild provided many local families with necessary commodities during those difficult war years, and later the Meals-on-Wheels service was introduced.

Today as we celebrate the 150th Anniversary of her entry into eternal life, Mary Aikenhead has reason to be proud and pleased to see how her sisters here in Crumlin and elsewhere throughout the world, are carrying on the works begun by her in 1815, inspired by their motto: -

Caritas Christi urget nos—The Love of Christ compels us

Feast of St Oliver Plunkett

Tuesday, July 1 is the feast day of St Oliver Plunkett, bishop and martyr. Oliver from Irish nobility, whose family supported King Charles I was ordained in Rome in 1654. Appointed Archbishop of Armagh in 1669, he was forced to conduct a covert ministry during the suppression of priests. Found guilty of high treason he was martyred 1 July 1681 at Tyburn by hanging, disembowelling, quartering and beheading. His head is in St Peter's Church at Drogheda, Ireland; most of his body is at Downside Abbey, England; some relics in Ireland.
