The Legacy of St. Patrick.

Wednesday next is a great feast day celebrating and enjoyed by so many not only in Ireland but throughout the world. It celebrates the life of a man who was, first and foremost, an evangelist, a man utterly dedicated to proclaiming and witnessing the gospel of Jesus Christ. St. Patrick was an answer to the prayers of disciples through the centuries who responded to the Lord's command to 'pray therefore the Lord of the Harvest to send our labourers into His harvest' [v.2]. There can be no doubting of the Saints' passion to evangelise when you read his words : In short I am a slave of Christ in a remote country because of the unspeakable glory of eternal life which is in Christ Jesus Our Lord'.

St. Patrick is also an outstanding witness of faith. His life was rooted in three things: His conversion, his prayer and his humility. Of his conversion to Christ: 'I was like a stone lying deep in mud but he that is mighty lifted me up and placed me on top of the wall.' Of Prayer he said: 'In a single day I have prayed as many as a hundred times, and in a night almost as often.' a Spiritual and holy man, he has left Ireland's sons and daughters a legacy of humble service and love of God, given expression in the words: 'I have been promoted beyond measure by the Lord and I was not worthy or the kind of person to whom the Lord might grant this, and misfortune are more appropriate for me than riches and luxury.'

The Church in Ireland is going through a particularly hard time at the moment, brought upon itself as a result of the sin, darkness and confusion of some of its clergy. The abuse of children is a terrible blight on St. Patrick's rich spiritual legacy. However, by the grace of repentance the spirit of humility and a call of conversion, the Church in Ireland will recover and build again on the shoulders of our brother and patron St. Patrick.
