The New Roman Missal

We are now into our fourth month of celebrating the Eucharist with the 3rd
edition of the Roman Missal. Change is never easy and for both priests and
parishioners it has taken time to adjust to the new translation of the Mass.
Now would be a good time to stop and ask ourselves how are we getting on
at this stage with the prayers and responses? Most people have by now
adjusted to the main change, 'And with your spirit' however there are one
or two other parts of the Mass that I would like to remind people have also
changed and they still need to be worked on. The preface to the Eucharistic
Prayer is a dialogue between the priest and the people. I would ask
everyone to please note this new dialogue, it can be found on the parish
newsletter or please use one of our laminated cards with the new responses
on it:

Priest: The Lord be with you
People: **And with your spirit.**
Priest: Lift up your hearts.
People: **We lift them up to the Lord**
Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God
People: **It is right and just.** (*We no longer say: It is right to give
him thanks and praise*)

This is the correct dialogue for the preface to the Eucharistic Prayer. Also
the Eucharistic Prayer is said only by the priest. The end of the Eucharistic
Prayer is called the Doxology when the priest prays: "Through him, and with
him, and in him, etc". This prayer is reserved to the priest (GIRM #236) after
which the people respond with the great "Amen". We gather as one body
to praise and worship God and we all have our own parts to play and pray in
that praise and worship, so I ask all of us to be aware of our own roles
within our Eucharistic celebration and together may we always give fitting
praise and worship to God.
