**Archbishop Martin's Letter to St Agnes Parish Pastoral Council**

Archbishop Diarmuid Martin has recently responded to a letter sent by the Parish Pastoral Council, following a meeting held with parishioners of St. Agnes, to discuss the publication of the Murphy Report. The Archbishop's response is summarised below.

The Archbishop acknowledges the horror that many feel at the nature and extent of sexual abuse of children by some priests and the anger at the way in which the Church then failed to respond to those who were abused. His Grace also describes how tragically, the mismanagement of these cases allowed the crimes against children to continue, at times for many years. The Archbishop states that good child protection policies indicate how the sharing of information is a key factor in preventing abuse. The climate of secrecy on an institutional level, coupled with the desire to avoid scandal and protect priest offenders, led to knowledge not being exchanged and this contributed in a significant way to the abuse becoming more widespread.

The publication of the Murphy Report has been a traumatic time for survivors. For some they found themselves reliving the abuse that they had suffered. Many were shocked to know for the first time that they were not the only person abused by a particular priest. Others had never before spoken about their abuse. All were angered as they looked back on the way they were treated and at times not believed. The Archbishop states that no words of apology will ever be enough. His Grace asks parishes to reach out, insofar as they can to support survivors who may live among them and to be sensitive to their trauma. One of the best ways to show our intentions is to ensure that our child protection policies are scrupulously respected.

The Archbishop states "I know that many feel alienated and disillusioned by the Church and especially by those in pastoral leadership. Yet many such people still wish to follow the message of Jesus Christ and feel the importance of that message for their lives. There is a wide spread desire to move forward in a programme of evangelisation and renewal in the Church. This does not mean leaving aside the hurt of those abused. There can be no turning back on that recognition".

His Grace also discusses the importance of encountering the Word of God in the person of Jesus, as contained in the recently distributed Gospel of St. Luke. The Archbishop says "my hope is that an encounter with the kindness and mildness of Jesus will help all of us to turn away from any trace of arrogance in Church life and will bring us back to a true understanding of our faith in its essential characteristics. The more we learn to live as Christ lived, to teach as Christ taught and to care as Christ cared, the more we will arrive at true renewal in the Church".
