The Old Violin

One day the great violinist Fritz Kreisler walked into an old antique shop which specialises in the sale of musical instruments. Somewhere at the rear of the building someone was playing a violin. The music was of incomparable beauty and quality that Kreisler in rapt attention listened spellbound. He politely asked to view the violin, and having examined the instrument he offered to purchase it. Even though Kreisler was prepared to make any sacrifice to purchase the violin the shop keeper was adamant that he couldn't sell it because it had already been sold to a collector who intended to add it to the small museum he owned. Determined to secure the precious instrument Kreisler sought out the collector and with great persistence tried to persuade him to sell the violin to him-but to no avail! Finally he obtained a concession - he would be allowed to play the violin himself.

In later life, recalling the incident, Kreisler declared 'that day I played like one condemned to death would have played to obtain a reprieve.' For I felt that that violin was not meant to be an antique to be looked at but an instrument to bless the world with. When he had finished playing and had slowly laid down the violin the collector, moved by the 'touch of the master's hand' and with much emotion declared 'I have no right to keep it-it belongs to you. Go out into the world and let it be heard'. God's gifts are given on loan to be shared. Of all His gifts the gift of His Son to us is His greatest gift of all. We are called upon as Christians to love Him and make Him known to others by the way we live and act. 'Go out to the whole world and proclaim the Good News.' is the invitation of Christ Himself.
