Retirement?

When I ministered in one Parish in the Diocese, I remember a woman telling me about her father who had recently retired after a lifetime working for the Council. He was always an early riser and was up in the Council Yard soon after 7am each weekday morning. There he enjoyed the companionship and banter with his fellow workers before he began his work at 8am. He was suffering from withdrawal symptoms. He missed his friends and was showing signs of depression. His daughter spoke to the supervisor. It was arranged that he would go to the yard as was his custom and then come home for breakfast when the lads went to work. This raised his spirits and gradually he was able to let go.

Some people look forward to retirement and the opportunities it presents, opening up new horizons. For others it is a difficult moment in their lives. There is a danger, especially for men, that they take on a sedentary lifestyle. It is important to keep physically and mentally active and socially involved with people as well as family.

They say that priests never retire and that is true, especially nowadays, as there is a growing shortage of priests. This year I am stepping down as Parish Priest of Crumlin after 12 years. After taking a break in the Autumn, I hope to return to St Agnes if the Archbishop allows me and as I have requested. The gap will allow the new man, whoever he may be, to get his feet under the table. I hope God will continue to give me good health and energy so that I can minister into the future. Sitting in front of TV and reading books would not suit my style. Who knows new opportunities and horizons may present themselves.
