Thought for the Week

"O Eternal Trinity, You have given Yourself to me— what greater could you give
me." St. Catherine of Siena.

What's in a name?

'In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit'. Christians are
baptized in the **name** of the Father and of the Son and of Holy Spirit: not in their
names, for there is only one God the almighty Father his only Son and the Holy Spirit:
the Most Holy Trinity. (CCC 233) The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central
mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in
the 'hierarchy of truths of faith. (CCC234) Why is the doctrine of the Holy Trinity the
most important doctrine of our faith? Because the doctrine of the Holy Trinity answers
the question: Who is God?

God is not an abstract theory or a static principle. God is within Himself a family, a
community of knowing and loving. We believe in one God. Many people who are not
Christians share that belief. It was only Jesus, however, who let us in on the rest of the
story. "Within" this one God there exists, from all eternity, a community of life and
love involving the three persons we call Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The one thing I
remember from my studies in Maynooth in relation to the Holy Trinity is that: The
Holy Trinity is a mystery to be explored not a problem to be solved. God is a family of
love and we are called to share in that love, the love that never ends. It is the love of
the Holy Trinity that calls us here week in week out: to praise and worship God our
Father in the name of Jesus his Son in the power of the Holy Spirit.
