God continues to call us to lives of witness for one another.

The Year of vocations began on Sunday 13th April and will continue till Sunday, May 3rd. The fundamental premise of the Year of Vocation is that the Lord continues to guide and direct. God continues to call. God calls us to live lives of witness for one another. He calls us all to communion with Him and each other-calls us to love. He calls us to a life of service. These three are the kernel of the Year of Vocation. It seeks to renew the fundamental call of every baptised person to Jesus Christ and His power to renew and transform. The Year will seek to teach the meaning of witness in the 21st century. In very practical ways, the Year of Vocation will enable people to love and serve all human beings in all walks of life-those who are married, those single, those living lives of celibacy. It calls us all to be 'a community of people who believe in the God of Jesus Christ and who commit themselves to implement in the world the commandment of charity which He left them'. Once our eyes are opened by an awareness of God's love, which is the heart of the Gospel, we cannot but serve Christ. For service is essentially returning God's love through acts of charity, with special attention to the needs of others. The Year of Vocation will showcase good news stories about the life and work of the Church. It is hoped that the Year of Vocation will result in greater understanding of the value of vocation in our everyday lives. A key objective of the Year is for the meaning of vocation to reach as wide an audience as possible so that people will be challenged to discern and explore their own specific vocation in life-be it priesthood, religious or lay. This Sunday we will hear good news stories of witnessing, love and service for one another from our representative to the World Youth Day. We will hear the challenges posed by Pope Benedict to the youth of the world and how she is implementing them in her everyday life in college, home and parish. Next Sunday is Mission Sunday we will be hearing stories from Missionaries from around the world. We will have an opportunity to read from a display-stories from at home and abroad. What would my story be if I were to tell it or write it? Sister Margaret.
