Safety First

As I pen this article midweek, four families are burying their dead who died in road traffic accidents last weekend. One young man who was killed was just 18 and another 22 years old. They should not have died- their lives lay ahead of them. The families of those four people are grieving and in pain.

National Road Safety Week is coming to an end. It is a time to reflect. The causes of road accidents are not all alcohol related. There are many reasons- drugs-giving the driver a "buzz" behind the wheel, speed, carelessness, falling asleep at the wheel, distractions, people with eyesight problems, etc.

When God spoke to Moses and gave us the 10 Commandments, he gave the 5th one, which says "Thou Shalt not Kill". God was not talking about death on the road. The only transport at the time was by animal or the occasional chariot. The modern chariot or motor car can be a lethal machine. The 5th Commandment has a new meaning. If you drive respect other road users; always show courtesy, avoid excessive speed. Make sure you are in a fit condition to drive. On a long journey take a break. Better to arrive late than not to arrive at all.

May I as driver myself make a special appeal to pedestrians. You see pedestrians step off the kerb without looking. If you are a driver watch out and be careful if children are about. They sometimes do the unpredictable. Sadly over the years I have had to do a funeral Mass of a child killed on the road. I find such occasions very difficult.
