Chile

Hi!

My name is Carlos, I am from Colombia and I have been here for more than six years in Chilean jails. It has been a long hard journey but I can see now a lot of positive things have happened to me since my arrest.

I am 44 years old and for the first time in my life I can look at a clear horizon and know what I want and what I can do. This is thanks to the crowds of benefactors doing good for us especially for the constant support of Sister Angela McKeever. I met her at the beginning of my reclusion. She has been for me and my mates a person full of kindness and understanding. I say this because it is not only the economic support she has given me but also the spiritual and emotional. For all these years with other mates we established different workshops. We helped the blind by making abacus, books in Braille and sticks. We also manufactured didactic toys for different foundations.

Now I am working on a new project with photographs, printers and pieces of copper. In here with your support I learned new jobs that in the future will be my support. I will be able to get tools and keep going ahead. I have faith in God that I am going to have the peace that I was searching for in my life.

Once again in my name and the name of my mates I want to send our endless gratitude to all the benefactors that help the Hermanas San Columbano and give a new opportunity to reintegrate by the right way to society, and our families will also be thankful. I have a future, very different from what I had when I came to jail.

To Our Indian Community...

The Catholic Church in India has had its first woman saint last Sunday October 12th when Pope Benedict XVI canonised Sr Alphonsa of Kottayam, Kerala, 62 years after she died.

"It is a matter of great joy for the Indian Christian community that one of its believers is being canonised."

Delhi Catholic Archdiocese spokesperson Rev Dominic Emmanuel said. "The Christian Community here is excited... we believe there is one more saint in heaven for India to pray to."

Born Anna Muttathupasathu in 1910 in Kudamaloor, near Kottayam, Sr Alphonsa lost her mother at an early age and was brought up by her maternal aunt. The family wanted to marry young Anna off, but she was keen on following the religious path. She assumed the name, Alphonsa, after joining the Franciscan Clarist convent in Bharananganam in 1927.
