**Ad Gentes Divinitus**

Having been divinely sent to the nations that she might be "the universal sacrament of salvation", the Church, in obedience to the command of her founder (Mt 16:15) and because it is demanded by her own essential universality, strives to preach the Gospel to all peoples. The apostles, on whom the Church was founded, following the footsteps of Christ "preached the word of truth and begot churches". The Church on earth is by its very nature missionary since, according to the plan of the Father, it has its origin in the mission of the Son and the Holy Spirit. From the beginning of his ministry the Lord Jesus "called to himself those whom he wished and he caused twelve of them to be with him and to be sent out preaching" (Mk 3:13; Mt 10:1-12). Later, before he was assumed into heaven (Act 1:11), after he had fulfilled in himself the mysteries of our salvation and the renewal of all things by his death and resurrection, the Lord, who had received all power in heaven and on earth (Mt 28:18), founded his Church as the sacrament of salvation; and just as he had been sent by the Father (Jn 20:21), so he sent the apostles into the whole world, commanding them: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit; teaching them to observe all that I commanded you" (Mt 28:19)

If we do this with confidence and conviction, then we really are continuing the missionary tradition of the first disciples.
