**Mission And Ecology**

The year 2011 is the International Year of the Forests and the United Nations aim is to create awareness of the urgency to protect fragile forestry and encourage a greater sustainability in their use. This International Year will help cultivate an appreciation of the role of forests in conserving the strength and vitality of the planet, as well as achieving certain goals in global development, particularly those outlined in the Millennium Development Goals.

Because the earth was entrusted to human stewardship, the natural world is not just a resource to be exploited but also a reality to be respected and revered as a gift and trust from God. It is the task of human beings to care for, preserve and cultivate the treasures of Creation... The natural resources of Creation need to be protected against the harmful policies of some industrialized nations and increasingly powerful transnational corporations which can lead to deforestation and plunder of the land, pollution of rivers by mining, over fishing of profitable species, or fouling the fishing-grounds with industrial and nuclear waste.

One group of people who have tried to ensure environmental sustainability are the Subaanen people an indigenous population in Midsalip, Northwest Mindanao in the Southern Philippines. They depend upon the Earth and its plants and animals for their livelihood. For them the Earth is not something to be owned, bought and sold: it is an inheritance given by God. They use the land and then let it rest. They share the fruits of the earth and of the forests, taking care never to deplete any part of their inheritance. They face a serious challenge. Mining companies have been given the right to extract iron and other ores from the mountains in which they live. Their way of life will be utterly destroyed.

Meanwhile Irish Missionaries and others continue to accompany these people in their struggle to continue their way of life. There are many ways we can be in solidarity with them: creating awareness, examining our relationship with the environment, being conscious about what we eat/wear and keeping ourselves informed on global issues.

**2nd November: Norms for Indulgences at the Commemoration of All Souls.**

1. From 12 o'clock noon on November 1st until midnight on November 2nd, all who have confessed, received Holy Communion, and prayed for the Pope's intentions [one Our Father and Hail Mary, or any other prayer of one's choice] can gain one plenary indulgence by visiting a Church or Oratory, and there reciting one Our Father and the Apostle's Creed.

This indulgence is applicable only to the souls of the departed. Confession may be made at any time within the week preceding or the week following November 1st.

2. The faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead may gain a plenary indulgence applicable to the Holy Souls on the usual conditions once per day from 1st to 8th of November. The conditions mentioned above apply also to this.
