A Time of Change.

The Summer is over and Autumn begins. The days are getting shorter and schools reopen. It is also this year, especially for our Parish, a time of change and a new beginning.

This weekend, Father John retires as Parish Priest after twelve years at the helm. But he is not gone forever. After a sabbatical break he will resume as what is called a 'Team Assistant' from the 1st of December. This means that he will help across the 3 Parishes of the Pastoral Area-Crumlin, Mourne Road and Clogher Road.

Father Michael Scott who has been with us for a couple of years as a curate, is stepping down, but will lend a hand when he is available. However, he is not being replaced by the Salesians. Father John Foster will become a Parish Chaplain with effect from this weekend. This will give him a more limited Ministry into the future.

This weekend we welcome Father Paul Tyrrell who replaces Father John. He comes as Co Parish Priest and has ultimate responsibility for the administration of St. Agnes Parish in cooperation with the other priests of the Parish and the Team. I know that we will give him a real Crumlin Parish welcome and we hope he has a very happy stay and pray that his Ministry here may be fruitful and fulfilling. Keep him in your prayers.

I am from Meath Street in the Dublin Liberties. I entered Clonliffe in 1970 and was ordained to the priesthood in 1976. I am a graduate in theology BD from the Angelicum University in Rome and a post graduate of the University of London (Heythrop College) where I obtained my masters degree in 1992.

Before coming to St. Mary's I spent one year ministering in Greystones after returning from sabbatical leave in Thailand and Indonesia. During the period I worked with refugees on the Thai / Burma border and spent some time teaching English to street children in Jakarta.

I have worked in many parishes from Maynooth to Dalkey, City Quay, Finglas and Mourne Road. Fr Paul will speak at the Saturday Vigil Mass and at 11am Mass on Sunday Morning
