World Youth Day.

Last October Fr. Deasy offered me the chance to go to Spain for World Youth Day, a thanks for playing guitar in the choir over the last number of years. I registered with Catholic Youth Care, and being the only one from the parish going didn't stir me one bit. CYC were bringing a group from Dublin, and they held a few meetings for people to get to know each other, to work on the choir and to give some background on WYD. I joined the choir playing guitar, seeing as it was the reason I was going.

We stayed in a neighbourhood called Fuencarral and spent most of Monday acclimatising. That evening the local parish held a small welcome party for us in our accommodation, full of Irish music and Spanish dance.

The ceremonies officially began on the Tuesday with the opening mass. Our morning was spent registering and after that we headed for Sol, the centre of Madrid for our first WYD experience. It was packed full of people from all over the world, and after lunch we left to meet up with more of the Irish crowd for a short prayer service. We left for the opening mass and even though it didn't start until 8pm, the whole area was packed out from around 6. Afterwards we headed home, back to our school in Fuencarral.

Wednesday, Thursday and Friday mornings were spent hosting catechesis sessions. Wednesday was also Leaving Cert results day for a lot of us, so we spent the rest of the day in a theme park. Thursday was the arrival of the Pope, so we went to the city to join in the festivities and Friday was the Stations of the Cross.

Saturday was the day of the vigil. We left around midday and headed straight in. I struggled for the whole week to try and find a good way to describe the atmosphere of the event, so try having a metro full of people packed like sardines with everyone singing Jingle Bells in their own language, full of high spirits. The vigil was held in Cuatro Vientos, a big airfield and at night there was lightning and rain which was quite nice after the Spanish heat.

Sunday was the final mass with the Pope, and afterwards we headed back to Fuencarral through the enormous crowds. Tired after sleeping rough the previous night we relaxed all we could, and after a farewell mass in the church we all went for Chinese together and slept soundly that night, ready to head home the next evening.

Being one of the few people who went on their own it really meant a lot that everyone was so outgoing and friendly. The trip was amazing; I couldn't imagine it being any better. Finally, I'd like to thank the parish for footing the bill for this trip, it was a once in a lifetime opportunity and I'm so grateful that I was chosen to go.
