And With your What?

Last weekend was the first weekend to celebrate Mass using the new
congregational responses from the new edition of the Missal. The
order and structure of the Mass has not changed and the readings at
Mass have not changed. But it will take time for us to become
familiar with the prayers which have changed, and from the first
Sunday of Advent the priest's part will also change. The most
obvious change that you will notice is at the beginning and end of
Mass, before the Gospel, at the beginning of the preface and at the
sign of peace. So where does the response, 'And with your spirit'
come from? It reminds us of the greetings of St. Paul, for example,
to Timothy: 'The Lord be with your spirit' (2 Tim 4:22), a recognition
of the spirit that is among us as Christians, a spirit that we must live,
and, in greeting one another, it proclaims the presence of Christ
among us.

One of the words which RTE News were asks parishioners last
Sunday as they came out of Mass was the word 'consubstantial',
which is a word we find in the Creed. At the Council of Nicea in the
year 325 AD, the Greek word homoousios was used to express the
doctrine that Jesus, the Son of God is of the same essential Being
and substance as the Father. In Latin the term is consubstantialis, in
English 'consubstantial' a theological or technical word to express our
faith in the person and nature of Christ. So if you meet a reporter
for RTE News, now you can tell them what consubstantial means! It
is going to take some time for the new changes to take root in our
heads but by this time next year we will wonder what all the fuss
was about.

she will pass on the details to the Order of Malta.

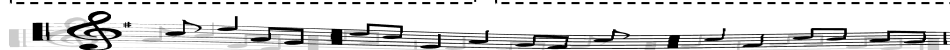
We would ask those who are able to walk to the altar steps to come forward for
