**Report from the Land of Oz**

Early in July we embarked with two separate groups off to Australia, with mixed feelings of excitement and nervousness. We set off representing the good people of St Agnes, to go to the largest gathering of young people in the world at World Youth Day. Here we spent time telling all of Australia just how wonderful it is to be a young member of this wonderful parish. Pauline's journey started in St Scols Parish in Melbourne. From here we both attended the opening Mass which was one of the most amazing we have ever been to. It was held in the Telstra Dome which is the home of the AFL in Melbourne, and believe you me, you have never been to such a great Mass until you have experienced over 500 priests doing the Mexican wave.



Following our time in Melbourne, we set off on a bus up the road to Sydney, for the real kick off of the celebrations. The final Mass was held in Radwich racecourse where we all slept under the stars in great anticipation of what pearls of wisdom the Pope would hand down to us. After waiting anxiously, and having many a person ask us to introduce them to the leprechauns, we were given the great privilege of hearing what His Holiness had to say to the young people of the world first hand!!
