- ⇒ **2nd November:** *Practising Prayer and discernment* - Fr. Brendan McManus SJ



John Henry Newman

This Sunday John Henry Newman will be Canonised in Rome. He was born in 1801 in London, he became an Anglican priest and served in the city in Oxford. There he formed what was called the Oxford Movement, he was a preacher, a writer and a religious leader and was highly regarded in the Church in England, and people travelled to hear him preach on a Sunday. In 1845 to the surprise and perhaps the shock of many, he became a Catholic and was ordained a priest 2 years later.

He was invited by the Bishops of Ireland to establish a Catholic University in Dublin. John Henry Newman was the first director of the university, however himself and some of the Bishops didn't agree and he departed Dublin in 1859. The university continued and evolved into what is known today as UCD, University College Dublin, now situated in the campus at Belfield.

He was a very spiritual person having gone through a conversion at the age of 15, and many Anglicans followed him into the Catholic Church. He wrote a very popular hymn "Lead Kindly Light" among others. He also wrote a very popular prayer which is often used at funerals. He was made a Cardinal by Pope Leo XIII and died at the ripe old age of 89 in Birmingham where he is buried. The University Church in St. Stephen's Green was designed and planned by Cardinal Newman. If you haven't visited that Church on the Green, do call in, it has a very unusual interior, it has a narrow entrance way and passage leads into the Church. This Church now is called University (Newman) Church.
