REFLECTION 18th APRIL 2021

Most of us have experienced the death of a loved one and we are familiar with loss and grief. At times our grief happens almost immediately but for most of us it is only after weeks or longer that we really sense the absence of our loved one. Grief is painful. Our lives are changed. We go through days of feeling normal and then we go through tough days of awful grieving, often alone and quietly. Some of us find comfort in the shared memories and stories. Some of us find comfort is talking with a trusted friend. If our grief is profound we may need to find a safe space with an empathetic counsellor to help us navigate our way through. Loss, in whatever form or shape, disturbs our inner calm and we become fragile and more conscious of our own mortality. We cannot always give ourselves the necessary *"self-compassion"* which helps us to unravel the entanglement of emotions. Some days are good, some are difficult and painful.

In today's gospel we see how the disciples cannot make sense of all the events they have witnessed. Nor can they make sense of what's going on when Jesus appears to them. On their own these men cannot make sense of anything. They need the Risen Christ to help them. The two Emmaus disciples have returned back to Jerusalem and share their experience of how they recognised the Risen Christ at the breaking of the bread moment. While the disciples are still talking, Jesus appears among them. They are ashamed of their doubts and believe they are seeing a ghost. Jesus appeals to the disciple's sense of touch, so that they see who it is they are touching. Jesus appeals to their reasoning, *"...a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have..."* But it is only when Jesus begins to explain what he meant by all the words he spoke to them before his crucifixion and opens their minds to understanding the scriptures that they come to believe in him. Only the Risen Christ can take the disciples from darkness to light, from mystery to revelation, from doubt to belief. This is the Easter gift of peace Jesus gives the disciples.

In this new awareness the disciples become witnesses to all that has taken place. They realise the significance of it and are now eager to share this good news with everyone. The understanding of the Church today is based on the unique experience of the first disciples. We are indebted to them and to the many generations of women and men who also gave witness to the life of Christ and who lived his gospel seriously. We are grateful to our parents and grandparents who shared their faith with us, the many whose Christian living was and is an inspiration to us.

Every generation must make the message of Jesus and the gospel its own and we are only too well aware of the challenges we face. We who are baptised in Christ must seek to live with fidelity to Christ and his gospel. There is much that distracts us in this mission but let us not lose sight of what we have been given – our Christian faith – and seek to live it as best we can. What way can you and I live more faithfully and in a more committed, Christian way that we inspire others to catch or re-find faith and the gospel of Christ. I like this quote by Maya Angelou (American poet): *"But when I found that I knew not only that there was God but that I was a child of God, when I understood that, when I comprehended that but more than that, when I internalised that, ingested that, I became courageous."*

May we have courage in living our Christian faith. *Fr. Tony.*

Last month, Pope Francis elevated Knock to an International Sanctuary of Special Eucharistic and Marian Devotion, placing it at the same level as Lourdes and Fatima. The Deep End - 'You are Witnesses of these things'

Today's Gospel is one of the resurrection accounts from St Luke's Gospel. It begins with the disciples recalling their experience on the road to Emmaus and how they recognised Jesus in the breaking of the bread. The Gospel continues into another account of the Risen Jesus with his disciples. Jesus interrupts the disciple's story and greets them with 'Peace' (Shalom) yet, in this account, they are terrified by this. Jesus shows them his wounds and Luke tells us that they are full of joy, but they still can't believe it and think it is a ghost. Jesus shows them that he is no ghost as he asks for food and eats fish with them. Jesus then journeys with them back through the scriptures in order to open their minds. He speaks to them compassionately, trying to relieve their anxiety and fear.

Jesus tells the disciples that 'you are witnesses of these things'. Luke wants to establish an important point, that these disciples are witnesses to the Resurrection, they ate with Jesus after his death and he opened their minds. The Resurrection accounts in the Gospels are not fantasy, they are the actual experiences of Jesus' disciples. So often in Luke's Gospel Jesus conveys his message through food and banquets, moments of celebration. The Risen Christ brings compassion and joy into difficult spaces. Today let us share with Jesus the situations in our lives which need an injection of compassion and Easter joy.
