He composed the score for a short film in which US-based Emmy-award winning filmmaker, Andrew Hinton, has adapted two of David Whyte's 'Blessing' poems. 'Blessing for Sound' and 'Blessing for the Light' are interpreted through a visual journey across the Irish landscape.
