Welcome back to our [Parish Newsletter Team](#) after the summer break. How the months of July and August have flown by! Soon other parish groups will be returning – Parish Pastoral Council, Liturgy Group, Choir, Finance Committee, Parish Centre Committee, Prayer Groups. Our choir is looking for new members, so if anyone is interested, please contact Dave O' Connor. Our Parish Church will be celebrating its 90th anniversary in 2025, so our Pastoral Council and Liturgy Group will be looking at ways to celebrate this special moment for our Parish. Ideas and suggestions will be very welcome. Presently the Liturgy Group is preparing for the Annual Mass of Remembrance in November. Our Pastoral Council is committed to forming a [Funeral Ministry Team](#) to help in the organising and preparation of funerals. In parishes where there is only one priest Funeral Ministry Teams help families with the preparation of a funeral mass, visit their home or funeral home to say prayers and may often go to the cemetery or crematorium. All the necessary training will be provided by diocesan Personnel from the Office of Evangelisation. We will also be training Eucharistic Ministers and Readers to lead a [Prayer Service](#) (Word of God and Prayer of the Faithful) followed by the [Reception of Holy Communion](#) after which there will be a final prayer. Again, many parishes have already implemented this format in the absence of a priest. We will have more to say about these matters after our meetings in early October. We wish all the children and young people God's blessings as they return back to schools. We pray too that young people who have finished secondary schools may have success in furthering their education and work opportunities. May God also bless parents, guardians, grandparents, child minders and all our teachers. Sincere thanks to our parishioners for your kindness and support through the summer months.
