Thought for the Week

"Mission is a passion for Jesus and at the same time a passion for his people" - Pope Francis, Mission Sunday in 2015

MISSION SUNDAY

Today we honour our **MISSIONARIES**, spread across the world, our Irish women and men, religious, priests and lay workers who have literally left all to follow Christ but who are to be found in some of the poorest parts of our world. For this year's MISSION **SUNDAY**, Pope Francis chose a theme from the story of the disciples on the way to Emmaus, in St. Luke's gospel: 24:13-35: "HEARTS ON FIRE, FEET ON THE MOVE." The disciples were in a state of confusion and dismay after what had happened at Calvary but their encounter with Christ on this roadway and particularly at the table meal sparked an enthusiasm in them to proclaim the good news that the Lord had truly risen. The hearts of the disciples burned once again with joy and peace. Now they wanted to share this good news with everyone. Accepting the good news of God's love as revealed in Jesus inspired the disciples to continue his mission. This continuation of the mission of Jesus is the calling given to all the baptised people of God. But in a unique way our **MISSIONARIES** continue the work of Jesus in the poorest and darkest of situations throughout the world. Our Irish missionaries are to be found across the world, working in health care centres, hospitals, schools and parishes, walking with and working alongside those in abject poverty. Many of our Missionaries have been honoured by governments of the countries where they work and some have received awards from the Irish President and universities for their work in education and health care. The Religious Orders in our Parish have Missionaries -Columban Sisters, Salesians, Franciscan Sisters of Saint Joseph and the Sisters of Charity. Their regular magazines highlight their work and commitments and they are worthy of our admiration and prayers.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY is Pope Francis's annual appeal in support of overseas missions. It takes place in every Catholic Church throughout the world. Our donations to this collection this weekend will be a life saver for thousands of people whose lives are overshadowed by poverty, famine, war, displacement and violence. **PLEASE give as generously as you can to this annual MISSION COLLECTION at masses this weekend.** If you want more information, go to the "MISSIO IRELAND" website.
