#### **REFLECTION FOR SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT 2023**

A voice cries out in the wilderness – "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight." This is the great clarion call of John the Baptist. In his desert experience John becomes acutely aware of his mission – calling the Israelites to repentance, to return back to God and to prepare them for the great event of the birth of Christ. While in the desert his whole being is enlivened by the word of God. There's an urgency in his message. From the wilderness his voice reaches far and wide. It touches the hearts of many who had begun to think that God himself was forever distant and silent. People are hungry to be nourished again and they see in John the Baptist the true voice of God. The long silence of God is broken. Hope begins to emerge and light begins to shine.

As John continues to preach, his every word is caught by those listening to him. The people are inspired: they confess their sins and wrongdoing, thereby expressing their inner desire to walk in God's ways, their change of heart demonstrated in their public baptism.

The purpose of this mission by John is to prepare people for the great event of the <u>"One"</u> who is to come. And we know that <u>"One"</u> to be Jesus of Nazareth: Emmanuel – God-with-Us. Although John had his own followers, he does not make himself the centre of attention: his task is to point others to The Christ. He does this wonderfully. John knows his role in the larger plan of God and thus brings people to an awareness of Jesus coming into our world.

John is certainly the great encourager, the person who sees the potential for good and change in people's hearts and who touches them with the power of his words, precisely because he is absorbed God's Word in his own heart. John had a sense of his self-worth and value in the eyes of God and therefore could acknowledge the same in others. He saw what was best in people. This is our challenge too: to foster the goodness and greatness in one another, however reluctant we may be to do so. Martin Luther King Jr. said: "Everybody can be great because anybody can serve. You only need a heart full of grace and a soul generated by love." And Saint Mother Theresa said: "I can do things you cannot do, you can do things I can't: but together we can do great things." In the call of John the Baptist today, let us be encouragers of one another in all ways possible, especially in the ways of God.



# Sunday Liturgy of the Word

#### FIRST READING Isaiah Ch 40:1-5.9-11

A reading from the prophet Isaiah. "Console my people, console them" says your God. "Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for. that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes." A voice cries, "Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken." Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion, shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem. Shout without fear, say to the towns of Judah, "Here is your God." Here is the Lord God coming with power, his arm subduing all things to him. The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him. He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes."

The Lord is not being slow to carry out his promises, as anybody else might be called slow; but he is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways. The day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up. Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat. What we are waiting for is what he promised; the new heavens and new earth. The place where righteousness will be at home. So then, my friends, while you are waiting, do your best to live lives without spot or stain so that he will find you at peace.
