REFLECTION FOR THE THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Fans of Star Wars movies will know that the underlying theme of the films is that of the eternal struggle of light and darkness as equal forces in conflict with each other. In the Bible these twin themes are to be found in the book of Genesis right through to the book of Revelation. At the beginning of creation God said – "Let there be light." But we know that human beings ever since have fallen into much darkness. Just look at our world today! Nonetheless, God has always inspired people to seek the light, from the words spoken through the prophets, the psalmists and then in a most wonderful way, he revealed the light of his love, presence, compassion and mercy in the person of Jesus, "the light." In the Christmas story we read how, even the wise men needed the light of a star to guide them to the Christ child. The star was their light. They found their way. In the Song of Zechariah, in the gospel of St. Luke, we are told that God's purpose in sending his Son into our world was to "give light to those living in darkness and in the shadow of death, guiding us in the way of peace."

We have arrived at Gaudete or Joy Sunday and there is a new hope in the Word of God. Reference is being made to "the light." The great prophet, John the Baptist, is telling people that he is not the light but only a witness to the light. John is very clear that he is not the fulfilment of the promises of old but that the one who comes after him – Jesus – is the true light of God, visiting his people with his loving-kindness. John's role will be fully valued when the true light appears among the people. He speaks for and points out the light of God among us. What a wonderful, noble calling!

Like the people of old whom John addressed, we too are called to make way for "the light." Our role is to let as much light shine through the solid chunks of darkness that litter our human landscape. That may appear a mountainous task. It needn't be. So, how can we allow the light of God shine more brightly through us as we approach Christmas? We look at the darkness that often lives within us - the selfishness, the un-forgiveness, the lack of mercy, the neglect of those in need, infidelity to God and one another. Holiness of life to which we are called is the constant effort of letting Christ be the light that guides all that we do. Brene Brown said, "Only when we are brave enough to explore the darkness will we discover the infinite power of the light." Let's keep our face turned towards the light of Jesus Christ and the shadows will fall behind us. The light we embrace will be evident in hearts that are more caring, merciful and compassionate, hearts that see tears, needs and hurt and respond as Jesus would. Maybe we can pray more fervently, rediscover a new respect for Christ in the Eucharist. Shakespeare wrote, "How far that little lighted candle throws its beams. So shine good deeds in a dreary world." Imagine if we truly followed the light of God as shown in Jesus, how better a world we would have.
