## LENT 2024

Welcome to the Season of Lent. Lent comes from a word that means 'spring'. Spring is the time of new beginnings, rebirth and the bursting forth into new life. Just look at nature all around us. What miracles!! Spring is the season of hope which tells us that life is stronger than death, that the darkness of winter must give way to the light and life of spring. As a poet said: "Spring is nature's refusal to collect empty vesterdays". Lent is the acceptable time for us to call a halt to life as usual. We are being asked to look honestly into our hearts, to examine our relationship with God, with one another, especially within our families. We are invited to re-evaluate the things that really matter: our fidelity to God, our family, our neighbour, our sense of justice for those in need, our compassion, our caring, our witness to the Gospel of Christ, our respect for one another, our care for the earth, our reverence for Christ, our prayer. Lent is the acceptable time for a renewal in our faith, prayer and Christian living. The receiving of the ashes on Ash Wednesday was an outward symbol of our inner desire to be renewed in God's ways. We look to Jesus to learn from him, to be brought more deeply into God's life. . Because our lives can be filled to the brim with activities, mobile phones, laptops, it is easy to drift away from trying to live as Jesus did and we may find ourselves in a spiritual wilderness of some kind. Let us walk through Lent with this inner desire to be recreated in God's ways and arrive at Easter Sunday renewed, changed, different and more rooted in Christ.

A reading from the book of Genesis. God spoke to Noah and his sons, "See, I establish my covenant with you, and with your descendants after you; also with every living creature to be found with you, birds, cattle and every wild beast with you; everything that came out of the ark, everything that lives on the earth. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to a God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has

entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.
