HOLY WEEK FOR CATHOLICS

HOLY WEEK is the most important week for Catholics when we commemorate the final days of Jesus's life from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday. Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus's triumphant entry into Jerusalem. The Gospel recounts the details of his death and passion, inviting us to reflect on the profound significance of Holy Week. We bless palms to remind us of this day. Then we Move through the week to **HOLY THURSDAY** which is the beginning of the **EASTER TRIDUUM**, the most sacred days of our Catholic Faith. The only Morning Mass takes place in the Cathedral of each Diocese at which the oils for the sacraments are blessed and given to representatives from each parish. These are brought up in procession at the evening **MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER** in all parishes. The Mass of the Lord's Supper commemorates the instituting of the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. We also remember and enact the Washing of The Feet to remind us of our calling to loving service of one another in imitation of Jesus. This Mass is followed by **WATCH and PRAY**, recalling the night before Jesus's crucifixion.

GOOD FRIDAY is the day Jesus was crucified and died. It was a day of incredible suffering for Jesus. The sacrifice of Jesus on the cross has gained for all of us the mercy of our God. His sacrifice on the cross has brought us the assurance of God's redeeming love and eternal life. This is a solemn day of mourning, prayer and reflection for all Christians.

The **EASTER VIGIL and EASTER SUNDAY** are the high points of Holy Week when we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. This is a most wonderful time for all Christians, who, through the death and resurrection of Jesus, believe that our earthly journey of following Christ will ultimately lead us to the glory of the Father's life where Jesus is.

In this Holy week, God is inviting us to walk with Jesus through his suffering, passion, death and resurrection and be renewed and transformed by the Risen Christ whom we encounter in the Eucharist. Let us prayerfully enter this most sacred, holy week.
