

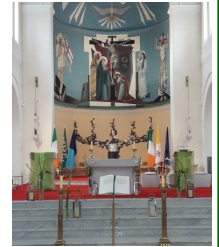

MISSION SUNDAY 19th OCTOBER 2025

Today we honour our **MISSIONARIES**, spread across the world, Irish women and
men, religious, priests and lay workers who have literally left all to follow Christ
but who are to be found in some of the poorest parts of our world. Accepting
the good news of God's love as revealed in Jesus inspired the early disciples to
continue his mission. This continuation of the mission of Jesus is the calling given
to all the baptised people of God. But in a unique way our **MISSIONARIES**
continue the work of Jesus in the poorest and darkest of situations throughout
the world.

Our Irish missionaries are to be found across the world, working in health care
centres, hospitals, schools and parishes, walking with and working alongside
those in abject poverty. Many of our Missionaries have been honoured by
governments of the countries where they work and some have received awards
from the Irish President and Irish universities for their work in innovative
education, outreach to the poorest and in health care services. The Religious
Orders in our Parish have Missionaries – Columban Sisters, Salesians, Franciscan
Sisters of Saint Joseph and the Sisters of Charity. Their regular magazines
highlight their work and commitments and they are worthy of our admiration,
support and prayers.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY is Pope Leo's annual appeal in support of overseas
missions. It takes place in every Catholic Church throughout the world. Our

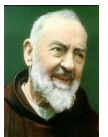

New Pilgrim Path-Pope Leo's First Major Document



"We must continue, then, to denounce the 'dictatorship of an economy that kills,' and to recognize that 'while the earnings of a minority are growing exponentially, so too is the gap separating the majority from the prosperity enjoyed by those happy few.'"

Pope Leo's first magisterial document, Dilexi Te ("I have loved you"), has just been issued by the Vatican. The document was begun by Pope Francis but his illness and death left it unfinished. Leo has completed it, in a clear statement of continuity with his predecessor's social justice teachings.

The document's central and powerfully expressed message is that encountering the poor is a fundamental way of encountering Christ Himself. Read Dilexi Te at : www.newpilgrimpath.ie.

Sunday's Liturgy of the Word

FIRST READING Ex.17:8-13

A reading from the book of Exodus.

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, "Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile, will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand." Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses' arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm till sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

Ps. 120.R.v.2

(R) Our help is in the name of the Lord who made heaven and earth.

1. I lift up my eyes to the mountains; from where shall come my help?

SECOND READING 2 Tim. 3:14-4:2

A reading from the second letter of St. Paul to Timothy.

You must keep to what you have been taught and know to be true; remember who your teachers were, and how, ever since you were a child, you have known the holy scriptures - from these you can learn the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and can profitably be used for teaching, for refuting error, for guiding people's lives and teaching them to be holy. This is how the man who is dedicated to God becomes fully equipped and ready for any good work.

Before God and before Christ Jesus who is to be judge of the living and the dead, I put this duty to you, in the name of his Appearing and of his kingdom: proclaim the message and, welcome or unwelcome, insist on it. Refute falsehood, correct error, call to obedience - but do all with patience and with the intention of teaching.

Jesus told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and never lose heart. "There was a judge in a certain town," he said, "who had neither fear of God nor respect for man. In the same town there was a widow who kept on coming to him and saying, 'I want justice from you against my enemy!' For a long time he refused, but at last he said to himself, 'maybe I have neither fear of God nor respect for man, but since she keeps pestering me I must give this widow her just rights, or she will persist in coming and worry me to death.'

And the Lord said, "You notice what the unjust judge has to say? Now will not God see justice done to his chosen who cry to him day and night even when he delays to help them? I promise you, he will see justice done to them, and done speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?"
