Latin Mass Chaplaincy

On Sunday 2nd December, the Latin Mass Chaplaincy will hold its inaugural Sunday Mass in it's new home, St Kevin's, Harrington St. The Mass will be at 10.30am (confessions from 10), and will be a Solemn high Mass. The Lassus Scholars will sing Palestrina's Missa Brevis.

The Latin Mass Chaplaincy was established by Archbishop Martin in response to Pope Benedict's Apostolic Letter Summorum Pontificum, and caters for the faithful of the Archdiocese attached to the older form of the Roman Liturgy (commonly called the Tridentine Mass)

Regular Latin Mass times in St Kevins are as follows:-

Sundays and nonworking Holy Days: Sung Mass at 10.30am (confessions at 10)
Working Holy Days: Low Masses at 8am and 7pm
Monday to Friday: Low Mass at 8am
Saturday: Low Mass at 9am
First Fridays: Low Masses at 8am and 7pm

Waiting in Hope

Advent is a journey, and the destination is Christmas. So much of this journey, like your whole life's journey is about letting yourself be open to what God is trying to say to you through the rituals, images and stories of the season. The wonderful thing is that your experience of Advent will change from year to year. But the best part of the journey is that you bring the unique gift of your own life experience to it. Imagine yourself on a long car ride with family, maybe on your way to a family vacation or visiting relatives? How many times on the way does someone in the car ask, "Are we there yet?". Even though it sometimes seems like time is standing still, the car and everyone in it are moving slowly towards a destination. And along the way, despite some periods of anxiety and frustration, it's not all that bad! Perhaps on the long ride, you get a chance to do things you might not have had a chance to do otherwise. Maybe you read a book, chat with family, listen to some music, or play games. Whatever the case, there is activity on the journey.

Like a long car ride, Advent is a journey towards a destination. It is a time of waiting. But also like the car ride, it is a journey of activity along the way. What is it we are waiting for during Advent? The obvious is "Christmas!" but Advent is about more than just waiting for a holiday, and it's even about more than just waiting for the birth of Christ. What we do during the journey itself is just as important as the destination. How will you spend your time of waiting this year? Consider these questions as you journey through the first week of Advent:

1. What are the places in my life where I am waiting for God to do something for me?
2. How can I focus on the journey of Advent more than the destination, to make the most out of my waiting?
3. What can I do to prepare the way of the Lord in my home? In my school? In my community?
