Praying For the Dead

Although the first and second books of Maccabees were not in the Jewish Scripture, the Church gave recognition to them because there is much to be learnt from them in relation to praying for the dead, the merits of the martyrs, intercession of the saints (at least as seen from a Christian viewpoint) and the resurrection from the dead... "Next, the valiant Judas urged the people to keep themselves free from all sin, having seen with their own eyes the effects of the sin of those who had fallen; after this he took a collection from them individually, amounting to nearly two thousand drachma, and sent it to Jerusalem to have a sacrifice for sin offered, an altogether fine and noble action, in which he took full account of the resurrection. For if he had not expected the fallen to rise again it would have been superfluous and foolish to pray for the dead, whereas if he had in view the splendid recompense reserved for those who make a pious end, the thought was holy and devout. This is why he had this atonement sacrifice offered for the dead, so that they might be released from their sin". (2 Maccabees 12: 42-45) And that is why every November we remember and pray for our departed brothers and sisters. May they rest in peace. Amen




All Are Welcome
