Empowered by Love

In this month of May our reflection turns appropriately to the place of Mary in our Pilgrimage of Faith.

Mary is at the centre of the little group who had gathered in a room after the departure of Jesus. These friends and followers of Jesus were praying with His Mother when 'suddenly', Luke tells us, the Spirit came. He was there, as their Lord had promised before His dreadful death. 'He will be my witness' [John 15:26]. The Spirit of God, the Third Person of the Trinity, the Love of the father and the Son, 'filled the entire house.' And at the heart of that house, at the centre of that community on the day of Pentecost was Mary. On that day the world entered a new dimension, a new period in the history of human evolution. The world was 'charged with the Glory of God' and nothing would ever be the same again. This was the new creation promised in the scriptures. It was now the time of the Spirit, the time for His power to express itself in the lives f the followers of Jesus. The Spirit is the Great Gift, the fulfilment of the promise of Jesus. Only now could they understand those words He spoke on the eve of His death, 'I will not leave you orphans' [John 14:18]. The Spirit would teach them and remind them of everything Jesus said and did. The inner truth of His life was now made plain to the simple fishermen and poor men and women who believed in Him. Now, already, they were preaching 'the marvels of God' to all who had come to Jerusalem on that day. And Mary, at whose word Jesus gave the first of His 'signs' at Cana, was present for this great outpouring of His glory on the Church. She had nursed the infant God, now she would look after the beginnings of the new community of her Son. Mary is always the humble handmaid of the Lord, always responsive to the movement of the Spirit and always our loving Mother. In her we have an image of the Church that has reached perfection, that is without sin. But we still struggle with the many temptations that come our way and often follow, not the Spirit of God but a path of selfishness. 'Pray for us sinners' we ask this most blessed of women. We ask her with confidence because although she is exalted above all angels and all people, 'she belongs to the offspring of Adam and is one with all those who are saved' [Lumen Gentium].

Our Blessed Lady will show us how to live a life open to the Spirit. She will show us how our ordinary, unremarkable life is the place where God is. She will lead us to her Son and we will experience His life in us. Full of grace, she wants nothing more than that we will be filled with the Spirit of God that through His grace and power we witness by our lives to her Son, Jesus. What a different people we would be and what a different world we would have.
