Doubting Thomas

All of us are familiar with the tendency to label Thomas, as a man of little faith. We call him "Doubting Thomas". We make the big mistake if we dismiss him that easily. For who can blame Thomas? He was disheartened – painfully disheartened. He was also disillusioned and angry. He had spent three years with Jesus, whom he loved deeply. In the last few days he had seen another friend, Peter promise fidelity to Jesus then deny him three times; and he had seen his Lord die the death of a criminal. Now Peter and the others tell him that Jesus is alive. It's just too much. Not surprisingly, Thomas refuses to believe on the words of others. Don't we do the same?

Thomas is honest, loving and spontaneous. He makes mistakes yet his mistakes are so honest that they lead to great faith. Yet he cannot believe that Jesus has risen. Again he is remarkable about this and through his honesty and Jesus' great love for him Thomas comes to the profound declaration of faith, " My Lord and my God ".

Unfortunately there seems to be something in us Christians that makes us frightened to be angry with God. It just doesn't seem right to be angry with an all loving God who has sacrificed himself on the Cross for us. Jesus can take our anger and our doubts just as he took those of Thomas. Many times I find it hard to believe, especially when I look at the problems that face the world to-day and I see how little I or others have changed. At these times I try to pray that beautiful prayer, "Lord, I believe, help my unbelief". And I find inspiration in Thomas, and in all those who asked honest questions. So to-day let us pray that we might be more like Thomas. Let us pray too to be honest and humble in our prayers, so we might come to a deeper faith in our Lord and our God.

Questions people ask

Q. How should one approach the Gospel stories of the risen Jesus appearing to various disciples?

A. In each story the Lord chooses a different way of making his new manner of presence known. Each story shows how Christians down the ages have come to know the presence of the Lord in their lives. With Mary Magdalen, recognition of the Lord comes in the experience of being called by name by the Lord. On the road to Emmaus faith comes at the breaking of the bread, an early name for the Eucharist. Thomas comes to faith in seeing and touching the wounds of the Lord. Many people have developed a deep personal faith by discovering the Lord through getting in touch with the wounds of life such as addiction, suffering or being the victim of injustice.
