Vocations and Priesthood Sunday.

This is the Year of Priesthood. Last year was devoted to vocations, and we the people have been distressed beyond measure by revelations contained in the Murphy Report. We did not know how to respond to the pain of the faithful priests as they saw the vocation they cherished sullied by events that should never have happened. Vocations fell to an all-time low, and we are today, feeling the effects of those lost vocations. It would be 'a holy and wholesome thing' to pray for our priests everywhere and to pray for vocations. If we, in our homes and in our workplace and especially around young people show that we respect our priests, need our sacraments, and live the difficult life of loving our neighbour, vocations may start to come back. Young men and women may be called to give their lives to Christ and to care for His people, His flock.

We cling to this hope in the St. Joseph's Young Priests Society. We say our Prayer for Vocations every day. We would like to see this small prayer included in the bidding prayers at all Masses, and at the end of all Rosaries recited in the church, and wherever public prayers are said.

It could be the start of a gentle crusade – the first positive steps toward the real fostering of good vocations. We meet on the second Thursday of each month in the Parish Centre after 10 o'clock Mass and finish with a cup of tea. We would love more members, to pray for vocations, and to support seminarians at home and abroad, with our contributions. Lack of funds should not deter a young person from offering themselves to the Lord of the Harvest.

We need priests and Religious to help us on our journey. We can help them on theirs.
